


Annie Camp Jr. High Student Drop Off/ Pick Up Procedure

General Information:

- Students that are walkers or car riders may enter or exit campus from the front or back of the building. All bus riders will arrive from the back of the building by the gym.
- Campus opens at 7:00 a.m.
 - 7th Grade Students report to the Cafeteria, 8th & 9th Grade students to the Game
 Gym until dismissed to class
 - Students are dismissed to classes at 7:43 a.m.
 - Classes begin at 7:50 a.m., any students arriving after that time will be considered Tardy
- Dismissal is at 2:50 p.m.
 - o Students dismissed by cohort (Bus Riders, Car Riders, Walkers)
 - o Students need to go to their bus, ride or begin walking immediately
 - o Campus Offices close by 4:00 p.m.

CELL PHONE POLICY

In accordance with the Arkansas "Bell to Bell, No Cell" Act, Annie Camp Junior High has a **NO CELL PHONE** policy for students. Students will not be allowed to have their cell phones or personal electronic devices (including smart watches) out at any time throughout the day. ONLY wired headphones will be allowed and will only be used for academic purposes (no bluetooth). Students will be allowed to have their cell phones out when the dismissal bell rings. Phones are available in the office for student use, if needed. Violation of this policy will result in disciplinary action.

DRESS CODE

The complete Jonesboro School District dress code policy can be found under Policy 4.25 - Student Dress and Grooming in the JPS Student Handbook.

At Annie Camp Junior High, we would like to emphasize the following rules regarding dress code:

- 1. Students are not allowed to wear hats, hoods, bandanas, or any other type of headgear. This includes wearing the hood up on a hoodie sweatshirt.
- 2. Students are not allowed to wear loungewear, pajamas, house shoes, or blankets.
- 3. Shirts must be long enough to completely cover the midriff when arms are raised straight over the head.
- 4. Shorts may not be shorter than five inches above the knee.
- 5. Pants may not have any holes or rips that show skin higher than four inches above the knee.
- 6. No spandex shorts or shirts. If wearing spandex leggings, a garment must be worn over the leggings that is no less than four inches above the knee.
- 7. All pants, shorts, etc. must be worn at the waistline.
- 8. Students may not wear any shirts or dresses that show a bare back or bare midriff.
- 9. Clothing may not display any inappropriate slogans, images, or language.

Failure to comply with the dress code will result in the student being asked to call home and have dress-code compliant clothing brought to them. If that is not an option, the student will be given clothing to wear that meets the dress code. Consistent dress code violations will result in assignment to in-school suspension.

BREAKFAST & LUNCH

All students are eligible to receive free breakfast and lunch. Breakfast will be offered everyday during first block classes. Lunch is served in the cafeteria and students eat with their grade level. Students are not allowed to have food delivered to them at school through a food delivery service. Students may wish to bring a refillable water bottle to school to keep with them throughout the day.

AC CLEARINGHOUSE

In order to encourage the positive behaviors that are expected of Annie Camp students, we have implemented a program called the AC Clearinghouse. This program is used to determine a student's eligibility to participate in certain activities and to attend certain school-related events, such as ballgames and dances. The Clearinghouse is fluid, and a student's name can be added and removed throughout the school year. If a teacher or administrator puts a student's name on the Clearinghouse, that does not mean that the student's name will be on there for the whole school year. Some reasons a student's name would be put on the Clearinghouse include:

- Lack of academic effort
- Office referral
- Lunch detention
- Tardy detention
- Less than 85% attendance rate
- ISS Assignment

TARDIES AND ATTENDANCE

Tardies are disruptive to the learning environment and result in students missing essential learning time. The bell schedule allows a sufficient amount of time for students to get from one class to another. The first tardy bell rings at 7:50 a.m. **Students must be in their first class at 7:50 in order to not be counted tardy.** Consistent tardiness can result in after-school detention and/or in-school suspension. Detention will be assigned after the 4th tardy. Tardies reset each quarter.

Any afternoon check-outs need to be done before 2:20 p.m.

Attendance at school is a vital part of the learning process, but we understand that absences are sometimes unavoidable. For an excused absence, please send a note to school upon the student's return or email our attendance clerk at iocelyne.flemon@jonesboroschools.net. Paper copies of a medical excuse can be turned in at the attendance office. Please refer to the student handbook for more details regarding the attendance policy.

CONTACT INFORMATION

It is VERY important that we have up-to-date contact information on file, as well as emergency contact information. Please make sure that your phone number, mailing address, and email address are all current. The majority of school communication is done through phone and email, and we want to make sure that all of our families are staying informed. Also, please make sure your student is aware of your contact information (phone number and address). STUDENT IDs

Students will be provided an ID badge & a lanyard. Students need to wear their IDs, so that their name, grade level, and picture are visible. IDs are used by the cafeteria staff when serving students breakfast and lunch. IDs are also used for entry to games and school events and for checking out books in the library. The cost for a replacement ID is \$3.00. Replacement IDs may be purchased in the library.

AC+

AC+ is our building-wide Response to Intervention (RTI) time. On AC+ days, the daily schedule will be adjusted. AC+ is a designated time each week in which students receive content interventions. For questions or more information about AC+, contact our Instructional Facilitator, Cassandra Sabbatini at cassandra.sabbatini@jonesboroschools.net.

TRANSPORTATION

If you have any questions about transportation to and from school, please call the transportation office at 870-933-5870. If your student was an active bus rider in the 24-25 school year, your student will automatically be assigned a bus for the 25-26 school year. If you have moved over the summer, are new to the district, or did not ride the bus last year, but need to ride the bus this school year, please scan the QR code and complete the Google Form. COMMUNITY SERVICE (9TH GRADE ONLY)

Ninth graders will be provided information regarding community service requirements in their Keystone class. Keystone is a one semester class, so some 9th grade students may not have it until the second semester. Annie Camp strives to provide many opportunities for community service throughout the school year. Students will be responsible for keeping up with their hours. According to state law, students are required to have 75 hours of community service by the end of their 12th grade year in order to graduate.

Annie Camp Junior High School Parents' Right to Know Letter 2025-2026



Dear Parents/Guardians:

Annie Camp Junior High School receives federal funds for Title 1, Part A programs. Throughout the school year, we will be providing you with important information about this law as it relates to your child's education. This letter lets you know about your right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of the classroom staff working with our child. Our district or school will be able to provide you with the following information regarding the qualifications of your child's teacher(s):

- 1. Whether the teacher meets the state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- 2. Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or provisional status because of special circumstances.
- 3. Whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and the field of discipline of the teacher's certification or degree.

If at any time your student has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher(s) that is not highly qualified, then you will be notified by the school. You also have the right to request information regarding the qualifications of the paraprofessional(s) assisting your child's teacher(s). If your child is receiving Title 1, Part A services from a paraprofessional, then our district or school is able to provide you with the following information:

- 1. Whether the paraprofessional has completed at least two years of study at an institute of higher education.
- 2. Whether the paraprofessional has completed an Associate's Degree (or higher).
- 3. Whether the paraprofessional has a met rigorous standard of quality through our state's certification procedure for determining the quality of paraprofessional staff.
- 4. Whether the paraprofessional has the knowledge and the ability to assist in learning activities, such as homework, reading readiness, writing, mathematics, and other support as appropriate.
